That's because Amazon actually owed money to the federal government in 2019. After two straight years of paying \$0 in U.S. federal income tax, Amazon was on the hook for a \$162 million bill in 2019, the company said in an SEC filing on Thursday.

Amazon has been the subject of much criticism over the fact that the company' ;s final federal tax burden has been particularly lacking in recent years. The c ompany also came under fire for seeking huge tax incentives worth billions of do llars as part of its search for a second headquarters, or "HQ2," in 20 18.

President Donald Trump is a frequent critic of Amazon for paying "little or no taxes to state and local governments," though the Trump Administration& #39;s 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act helped to lower the statutory corporate tax rat e.

Amazon also reported \$276 million in state tax payments in 2019, as well as an international tax bill of more than \$1.1 billion, according to Thursday's SEC

filing. And, the company notes in its blog post that Amazon also paid roughly \$

2.4 billion "in payroll taxes and customs duties" in 2019. However, paying something like payroll tax is hardly something to boast about, a ccording to Matthew Gardner, a senior fellow at the Institute on Taxation and Ec onomic Policy, or ITEP, a nonpartisan and nonprofit tax policy think tank. In a blog post responding to Amazon's release of its 2019 tax bill, Gardner notes that "economists agree that payroll taxes are ultimately paid by employees in the form of reduced compensation."
